

Owen A. Jackson is currently the VP/Business Development for the National Community Reinvestment Coalition (NCRC). In this role Owen is responsible for management and oversight of NCRC's MBEC's in Washington, DC and Houston, TX. Prior to assuming this position Owen was the director for the Washington DC Minority Business Enterprise Center (MBEC). In this position Owen was responsible for carrying out the mission of the organization outlined by NCRC and meeting the performance goals outlined by MBDA. Owen's time was divided between outreach, administrative and management of staff to carry-out the day to day tasks. Over the past six years Owen, has led the organization in providing over \$180,000,000 in contracts, \$780,000,000 in financing, creation of 1207 new full time jobs and provided services to over 930 businesses. Owen began his career as a chemist with General Foods Corporation, Maxwell House Coffee in 1985. He joined Union Carbide, Specialty Chemicals Division in 1987. He is listed on several patents for refrigeration and textile lubricants.

Owen was the recipient of numerous awards including the Small Business Person of the year for 2000, Robert F. Kennedy Award to a Minority or Woman Owned Business 2001 and the Department of Commerce, MBDA, Technology Person of the year 2001.
